SUBJECT: Threats to San Diego Fire-Rescue Personnel

Special Operations has seen an increase in threats made to San Diego Fire-Rescue personnel. Below is information on the most recent threat and a reminder on the proper process of reporting suspicious activities or threats to personnel.

Potential Threat to San Diego Fire-Rescue Personnel:

- On December 7, 2020 Jonathan Michael Hatem (AKA Johnny Hatem) used his Instagram account to post a vague threat on the Anaheim Police Department's social media page.
- On April 3, 2021 Mr. Hatem used his Instagram account to post a vague threat toward San Diego Fire-Rescue's Station 17.
- Based on social media posts, law enforcement believes Mr. Hatem could be a danger to himself or others.
- Mr. Hatem allegedly threatened to use a knife to assault and vandalize the vehicle of an acquaintance.
- Mr. Hatem frequents the Ocean Beach and Pacific Beach areas, possibly driving a maroon dodge van.

Process for submitting a Suspicious Activity Report (SAR):

- Report any suspicious activity or threats immediately.
- To access the Suspicious Activity Report (SAR), please follow the following steps:

 - Submit a SAR (Law Enforcement SAR Reporting)
 - Complete the Law Enforcement / Public Safety Reporting Lead Sheet
 - Click Submit SAR
 - Notify Battalion Chief Joe Scuri via the chain of command
