I. PURPOSE

To provide direction upon arrival at scene when an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has been placed on a patient.

II. SCOPE

This policy shall apply to all sworn San Diego Fire-Rescue Department (SDFD) (except lifeguards) and all Emergency Ambulance Provider personnel.

III. <u>AUTHORITY</u>

The fire chief authorizes the information within this policy.

IV. POLICY

When first responder crews arrive on scene and determine that both AED pads have been placed on a patient, the following steps must be taken:

- A. Remove the pads from the patient prior to applying first responder AED pads
- B. Determine from the user how many shocks have been delivered
- C. Contact Emergency Command and Data Center (ECDC) via radio, request "AED" response, and ensure this information is added to the incident CAD notes
- D. Include the AED deployment information in the prehospital radio report
- E. Leave the AED unit at scene with the owner
 - 1. Advise the owner to contact their service provider to put the AED back into service
 - 2. Document AED deployment information into the ePCR fields, including "who used the AED prior to EMS arrival"
 - 3. Document additional AED related information in ICHART
 - a. For example: "Patient found with lifeguards with CPR in progress. Lifeguards advise that AED applied, and 2 shocks were delivered."
- F. If the AED used was assigned to an SDFD unit, contact ECDC and advise that a city AED was used.
