DEPLOYMENT AND BUNDLING PROCEDURES

Cleveland Hose Pack Deployment



- •Hold first bundle securely with one hand
- Hold until bundle is placed on ground



•Release top buckle



•Release bottom buckle

Deployment continued...



•Place both hands on bundle with thumbs, split bundle in the middle



- •Place bundle neatly on ground
- •straighten bundle from horseshoe position



- •Spread hose apart from middle creating a circle
- Make sure male and female couplings do not get wrapped around hose

Deployment continued...



- •Line tender grabs both couplings
- •Male from center
- •Female from outside



- Nozzle person receives male coupling from new bundle
- •Line tender receives male coupling from last section of fire fighting hose
- Connections made
- •Call for water



Deployment continued...



Charge line



•Bundle will expand with minimal kinks



- •Immediate water to nozzle
- Advance line

Bundling Procedures



•Stretch 100' of 1 1/2" hose in a straight line



•Begin folding at male coupling. Fold hose inside 4'.



•Continue folding hose for entire length

Bundling continued...



•Bend hose around knee to form a horse shoe, pull tight to expel air



•First bundle is ready for pack



•Lay pack on ground with all straps loosened

Bundling continued...



- •First bundle secured by black straps
- Make sure bottom strap has bundle supports in place
- •Second bundle secured by orange straps



- •Third bundle secured by yellow strap
- •Make sure bottom strap has bundle supports in place

Bundling continued...



•300ft of Hot Line 1 1/2" single jacket light weight hose secured to a Cleveland hose pack



- •This pack weighs 47lbs.
- •The old style
 "Delta Pack"
 weighs 53lbs with
 only 200ft of 1 1/2"
 single jacket cotton
 hose
