I. <u>PURPOSE</u>

To provide direction regarding the pronouncement of death in the pre-hospital environment.

II. <u>SCOPE</u>

This policy applies to all sworn San Diego Fire-Rescue Department (SDFD) and Falck San Diego personnel.

III. <u>AUTHORITY</u>

The fire chief authorizes the information within this policy.

IV. <u>POLICY</u>

- A. <u>Dead on Scene</u>
 - 1. Any patient determined to be obviously dead, per County of San Diego EMS policy, requires an electronic patient care report (ePCR).
 - 2. It will be the responsibility of the fire first responder crew to complete required documentation for patients determined to be dead on scene and no patient care has been provided.
 - 3. Falck San Diego is responsible for documenting all patients who are pronounced dead on scene who have received patient care prior to the pronouncement.
 - 4. In the event a fire first responder unit is not assigned to the incident the transport unit is responsible for required documentation.
 - 5. Every effort should be made to ensure that patient information is complete, including:
 - a. Patient's name (exactly as it appears on Medicare/insurance card)
 - b. Patient's DOB
 - c. Patient's address
 - d. Patient's phone number
 - e. Patient's social security number
 - f. Insurance name and policy number
 - 6. Under no circumstances will personnel demand patient information from a grieving family member. If the circumstances permit, the paramedic should ask for patient information as tactfully as possible.
 - 7. Law enforcement will be requested upon patient pronouncement.
 - 8. If crime scene suspected, care should be taken not to disturb evidence.
- B. <u>Pronouncement of Death at a Licensed Care Facility</u> (for example, skilled nursing facility, assisted living, board and care, etc.)

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- Patients pronounced at a licensed care facility, or enrolled in hospice care, may be left on scene without requesting law enforcement. 1.
- Law enforcement will be requested for circumstances other than presumed 2. natural death.

- <u>Body Removal at San Diego International Airport</u>1. Dead bodies on airport property or aircraft will be moved only at the direction of Harbor Police Department.
