SUBJECT:	Standpipe Hose lay-shut off butts

Introduction: Historically San Diego Fire Rescue Department has used shut-off butts when connecting to standpipes up to 20 stories. The use of shut-off butts is not recommended by NFPA or IFSTA literature and is not standard practice nationally or locally.

Description:

- Shut-off butts could be inadvertently shut off by anyone on the fire scene.
- Shut-off butts are only rated to 200 psi (Akron Brass)
- There are limited amounts of shut-off butts per engine
- Ties up a firefighter to charge the standpipe.
- Takes longer to make hose connections to the Standpipe.

Training/Implementation: Any standpipe will be connected directly to the Fire Department Connection (FDC) utilizing the male coupling of a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " or 3" hose. The hose can be utilized from either the $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " bunk bed, 3" bunk bed, or $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " Quick attack hose load.
